Health Costs

Some people automatically get help with NHS charges, free prescriptions, optical vouchers towards the cost of glasses or contact lenses and healthcare travel costs because of their age or particular personal circumstances. For instance, children under 16 and adults aged 60 or over are automatically exempt from paying prescription charges. People with certain medical conditions are also exempt from prescription charges providing they have valid exemption certificates.

Some people (along with their partners and dependent children) can qualify for certain health benefits because they receive, or they are included in an award of someone receiving, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Income-related Employment and Support Allowance, Pension Credit Guarantee Credit or Universal Credit. Others may qualify for help with some or all of the costs because they are named on a valid NHS Low Income Scheme certificate. To find out more contact the NHS as follows:

NHS Prescriptions

Some chemists will deliver NHS prescriptions direct to your home. You should contact your chemist to confirm that they will do this and make the necessary arrangements.

If you or the person you care for needs a lot of prescriptions, and you are not entitled to free NHS prescriptions, it may be worth buying a Prescription Prepayment Certificate (PPC). If you need more than 3 items in 3 months or more than 11 items in 12 months, a PPC could save you money. You can apply by telephone or online and you will need a credit or debit card or bank details for this. Some chemists are also registered to sell PPCs.
